Storage of Vessels

At the June meeting in 2008, the Committee of Management, passed a motion that vessels that remain in storage after one full year are charged the regular storage rates, plus an additional 25%. For each additional year in storage, the previous year's rate will be charged plus an additional 25%. Please note: All requests for continued land storage must be approved by the COM as outlined in the yard rules.

The implementation of these fees will begin at the end of June, 2009.

Formation of a 'Design Team' for Catering at AYC
Expressions of Interest Sought by Thursday, March 19, 2009 at 5:00 PM

Background

As you know, last November the dining room and bar services at AYC were suspended following the departure of our catering service provider. Through December of last year and January/09, the COM made arrangements to bring a new caterer to AYC. Last week that arrangement was dissolved by mutual agreement between the new caterer and AYC after the caterer determined they could not adequately fulfill needs expressed by the membership.

At the Budget Meeting on February 24/09, I proposed that a 'Design Team' be assembled for the purpose of developing a 'contingency' plan for a sustainable, revenue positive catering operation at AYC. I suggested such a plan is necessary in order to avoid yet another unanticipated interruption in catering service. The concept was embraced by those present at the meeting, and a motion passed to implement this initiative. As a result of last week's development, we need to expedite the formation of the 'Design Team'.

The team will design a plan taking into consideration that AYC is many different things to our members, and as such this strategic initiative must integrate well into our primary business of being first a yacht club. Available resources will also need to be assessed and dedicated accordingly.

This is an opportunity for members to engage in a fully transparent process that will include regular progress reports and recommendations seeking the support of the COM and the membership. It's a chance for members to participate/own and manage a significant process at AYC.

The team will commence its work immediately following selection of its members, with the objective of having a Business Plan developed for the COM to review and present for approval by the membership at a Special Meeting.

In the meantime, the COM is working to implement short-term arrangements for the resumption of dining room and/or bar service at AYC and will keep the membership informed of developments as they unfold.

Objective

The 'Design Team' will be established to develop and support the implementation of a coherent and comprehensive Business Plan for catering services at AYC. To achieve its objective, the composition of the team will require a good representation of member categories. We also require capabilities related to various facets of setting up and running a small business operation, which we know are resident within our membership.

Call For Interest

We invite expressions of interest from Senior, Social and Life members with the skills, ideas and energy to contribute to the work this team must complete. The team will be representative of the AYC member categories. They will be a talented group of innovative thinkers with demonstrated initiative to advance the development of a sustainable, revenue positive Business Plan for catering services at AYC within a required deadline. Selected members will be expected to meet once a week for two to three hours for several weeks until the plan is developed. Interested members have knowledge and experience in one or more of the following areas:

- 1) Food & Beverage industry, hotel, restaurant and bar, at the management level
- 2) Accounting, bookkeeping, budget management planning
- 3) HR policy and procedure development and implementation
- 4) Strong business planning development skills
- 5) Public relations expertise

Interested members who are available to assist should send an e-mail to rearcommodore@armdaleyachtclub.ns.ca stating the area(s) they are interested in, and should include information about their background and the contribution they can make toward the work of the team.

FLEET CAPTAIN, SAIL Report by PAUL BEZANSON

A Race Committee meeting was held Feb 28th at AYC.

The Race Schedule will be similar to last year's. We are going to put a Seamanship race in the schedule. The Solo race has been eliminated for this season. I will get the Schedule posted on the web site ASAP.

The Officer of the Day format will continue for 2009. I will be asking for racers to sign up to be Officers of the Day for many events. Carl and Greg Baker will be running the Thursday night women's program again.

The Race Committee has decided to use the new PHRFNS handicap system supported by NSYA for this season. Handicaps will be adjusted on evening races after the spring and summer series. The Winning boat of each series will see its handicap raised 2 points. The second place boat in the series will see its handicap raised one point. I will work with Norman Schniederman to work out all the handicaps with adjustments for the Armdale boats. These issues and others will be further discussed at our annual sailing meeting on March 15.

The Race Committee also discussed clarifying the Finish line at AYC. It has been suggested we get rid of the shore based transit and make the finish line between the marker on the race hut and the outer (eastern) start/finish mark. The inner (western) start/finish mark would still be used as a spacer mark which must be honoured. This will be further discussed at the upcoming sailing meeting.

Dave Hickey has volunteered to look for Sponsors for our races. He has some promising leads. If anyone else knows someone who be interested in some advertising let us know.

Finally our race hut needs repairs. Don Longard and Dave Hickey have kindly agreed to look at the repairs needed and have it ready for the 2009 season.

**Message from the REAR COMMODORE

Dear AYC Members,

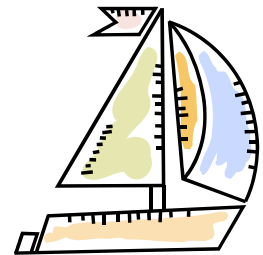

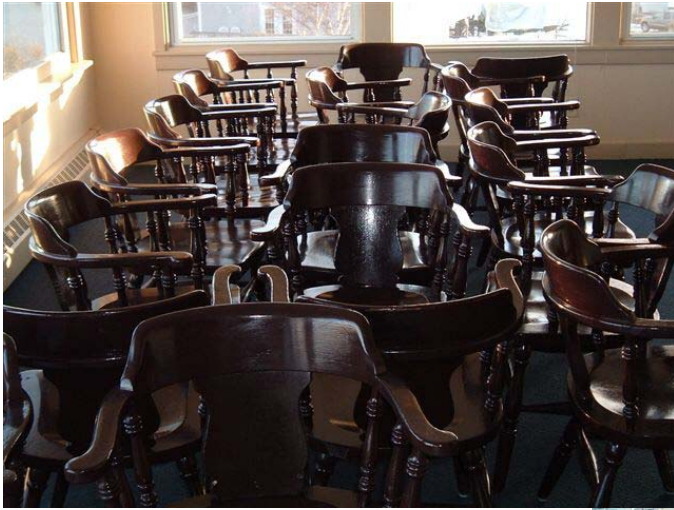
