Message from the Commodore, Jim McBurney

We are two and a half months into the year, and at AYC we have achieved a number of milestones.

A new Committee of Management has gelled into a team and brought forth an aggressive budget designed to curtail our age old deficit and to start us on our path to planning and funding long term projects. We are moving more toward electronic communications with our members and are on the verge of stabilizing the catering service. All these issues were discussed and supported by the membership at the Budget Meeting 12 February.

It is worth noting that if you missed the budget meeting, you missed the opportunity to see how AYC worked decades ago. The level of discussion and cooperation was high, the camaraderie was evident, and the goal of everyone present was to do what was best for AYC. When I went into the meeting, knowing what was in the budget, I was wondering what tar and feathers really felt like. When the meeting was over, I was left standing there with a foolish grin and an urge to run out and hug everyone.

In order to reduce and hopefully eliminate our deficit, each senior member will be billed two hundred dollars, and each social member thirty dollars. This is intended as a one time levy, but a large unexpected emergency expense might change the situation.

We brought in an annual one hundred dollar levy that will be put into a capital project fund, and the membership made it very clear that the money is not to migrate to general expenses. Bylaws will be amended to ensure the direction of the membership is followed.

Now that the budget is out of the way we will be dealing with the day to day operation of the Club. We have finally filled all the positions on the Committee of Management with Jeff Rowe taking on the job of Rear Commodore and Paul Bezanson volunteering to be the Fleet Captain Sail.

There will be a great deal more communication this year between the Committee of Management and the membership. We will be enhancing the AYC website and posting a lot more information of interest to members. If you are not receiving the AYC eNews you will be missing a lot of information. We can't afford to send that publication out by mail, but for those who do not have computers, we will post copies in the Club. I urge everyone to contact the AYC Office and sign up.

Message from the Treasurer, Leslie Samson

First of all, I would like to thank the Committee of Management and our Club Manager for all their input into the budget for 2008 and a special thanks to our Vice Commodore, Mike Casey, who took the time to go through the auditors financial statements with me, which gave me more understanding of how and why accountants do what they do.

At the February 12, 2008, budget meeting, the membership had approved an assessment of \$200.00 for Senior Members and a \$30.00 assessment for social members for this year, which will hopefully eliminate the deficit AYC has been carrying for many years. We also have put in place a Capital Projects Contribution of \$100.00 for Senior members which will continue every year and will be designated to Projects approved at a Constituted Meeting of the Club. This year, the membership approved at the Budget Meeting to designate some of this money to marina electrical upgrades.

As you are all aware, the membership bills went out early again this year, and also the locker bills went out as well. I heard from a few members who have lockers and did not understand why the lockers bills went out early. The lockers run on AYC fiscal year which is January - December and not May to April. The lockers will now be billed with membership, as this helps AYC cash flow problems at the beginning of the year.

I would like to thank all the members who were prompt in paying the invoices they received in January. This has put AYC in a positive cash flow position at the end of February.

In closing, I would like to thank our Club Manager, Christine, her assistant Kerri, and our Yard Foreman, Wade, Jim and Jody for all their hard work and efforts, so we members can enjoy our club.

Catering

I also chair the Catering Committee, which met diligently to assist with the selection of a caterer. The members of the Committee are: Anna Chow, Donna Harding, Dave Hickey, Andy Rice and Todd Thompson.

The Committee was instrumental in helping with the proposed contract with Hannah Gibson. At press time the details were still being finalized but we are hopeful an arrangement will soon be complete.

The Catering Committee did such a great job that their function has been incorporated into the proposed contract to meet quarterly with the caterer to discuss issues and problems.

Payment of Dues

The final item is the subject of payment of dues and fees. 99% of members pay these when they are sent a bill. In fact, under our By-Laws, if they are not paid within 30 days, the Club has the right to start suspension proceedings. This is seldom done; some leniency is always allowed.

However, there is a very small minority that continues to use the Club's facilities and services while not paying their fees and dues on a timely basis. Your Committee of Management has agreed to issue registered letters immediately to these individuals, indicating they will be suspended unless payment is immediately made.

If you are in the 1%, you may wish to pay immediately to avoid embarrassment by having your name posted.

I would be pleased to discuss any of these matters with you.

ADMINISTRATION of the
MINIMUM USAGE FEE
for CATERING at AYC

At the Budget Meeting in February, the membership passed a motion calling for the early billing of half of the Minimum Usage Fee (MUF) or \$100 with the 2nd installment to be billed later in the year.

Invoices for the 1st installment of the MUF have been generated based on member spending to February 29th; this amount has been subtracted from \$100 to determine the amount owing. In an effort to reduce administration in the office, any spending that occurs following the issuance of the invoice (after Feb 29th and before your invoice is paid) will not be deducted from your invoice. However, these amounts will be taken into account in the calculation of the invoice for the 2nd catering installment in October.

Once your October invoice has been calculated and sent, there will be no adjustment to the original invoice. Therefore, we strongly encourage all members to spend their catering amounts before Sept 30. This will simplify the administration of the catering assessment and greatly assist in reduction of the workload in the office.

Once your invoice has been paid, a "virtual gift card" will be set up for the amount of the invoice under your member name and number in the squirrel system. When you come to the club, let your server know you have a gift card and that you would like to use it for your purchase.

Keep in mind...

It is the responsibility of each member to provide their member number to the server when ordering, and to request a receipt when the bill is paid; this will help to ensure accurate tracking of your spending.

Gift cards must be used by December 31, 2008. If you can not use your gift card, you can request that your amount be

transferred to another member by submitting your request in writing to the office.

Catering invoices are treated the same as all other club invoices, interest will be charged on all accounts past due 30 days and failure to pay will result in suspension from the club.

Message from the Club Manager, Christine Bray

Membership invoices for 2008 are now **past due**... If you have not paid, please call the office to make payment arrangements as soon as possible.

Also, a number of members have not submitted updates for 2008. This update was included with your invoice, or mailed out to you if you receive emailed invoices. It is important that we receive your information at the beginning of each year, as this helps to keep our record keeping accurate and protects you in the event something happens to your vessel if you are away. You can fax your completed form to 477-0148 or email to office@armdaleyachtclub.ns.ca.

For those members who have submitted their updated forms, we are working on setting up the monthly payment amounts for 2008. By the time you receive this Burgee, the office will have contacted you with your monthly payment amount. An invoice that includes your yearly fees will be sent out to you for your records. If there are any errors or omissions please let the office know as soon as possible. Payments will be processed the first week of each month.

- ◆ As per last year, catering amounts have not been included in the payment plan, you will receive separate invoice(s) if you have not spent the required amount(s)
- ◆ You cannot add more services to the plan once it has been set up. Therefore, extra services will be billed on separate invoices
- ◆ If you use winter power, you have been billed at the same rate as 2007; this will be adjusted on your account when the meter readings are submitted to the office
- ◆ if any adjustments are required to bring your account balance to zero, you will be contacted by the office, and your payment amount adjusted for the final billing December 1st

If you want to be on the payment plan, you must submit your update form and indicate this request under the administration section of the form. We do not automatically set up members on the payment plan unless they have indicated that they wish to be on the plan in 2008, and have confirmed the services they use--even if you were on the plan in 2007. If you have not submitted the form, you will not be set up on the payment plan. **You have until March 15**, to submit this request. If the request is not received by this date, you will be invoiced as per the Billing Schedule as published in the upcoming editions of The Burgee.

Many members of the Club have been using these coatings for 25 years or longer and the only complaint we are aware of is that we can't make it available in green.
