## MESSAGE from the CLUB MANAGER, CHRISTINE BRAY

Winter storage season started November 1st; we are asking all members in wet storage to move to your assigned location as soon as possible. If you do not know what space you have been assigned or if your slip is not clear, contact the yard foreman.

As many of you have noticed, there is a new spar storage area for longer masts under the sail training deck. We ask that lighter masts be placed on the top racks in this area. Keep in mind, the other spar storage is still available for shorter masts. Please label your spar with your name and member number. Tags are available in the older spar storage area (the one with the double doors).

The last haul is November 28th, but land space is filling up fast. If you have requested land storage, we ask that you call now to book your haul out as we can not guarantee your space if you wait until the last haul out date.

A reminder, the gas dock also closes November 28th.

Winter is soon coming and the snow will be flying! We ask all members clear their docks to make room for snow removal.

Our AGM is being held Thursday, November 6th at 7:00 p.m. in the Upper Ward Room at AYC. All Senior, Life and Intermediate members are invited to attend.

Final invoices of the year for winter storage and catering were sent out October 8 and will be due November 8th. We ask that you pay these invoices before this date to avoid late charges.

We are expecting new AYC merchandise any day! If you are looking for gift ideas, check with us! We expect most of the order to be in by mid-November.

## ADMINISTRATION of the MINIMUM USAGE FEE for CATERING at AYC

At the Budget Meeting in February, the membership passed a motion calling for the early billing of half of the Minimum Usage Fee (MUF) or \$100 with the 2<sup>nd</sup> installment to be billed later in the year.

Invoices for the 1st installment of the MUF have been generated based on member spending to February 29<sup>th</sup>; this amount has been subtracted from \$100 to determine the amount owing. In an effort to reduce administration in the office, any spending that occurs following the issuance of the invoice (after Feb 29<sup>th</sup> and before your invoice is paid) will not be deducted from your invoice. However, these amounts will be taken into account in the calculation of the invoice for the 2<sup>nd</sup> catering installment in October.

Once your October invoice has been calculated and sent, there will be no adjustment to the original invoice. Therefore, we strongly encourage all members to spend their catering amounts before Sept 30. This will simplify the administration of the catering assessment and greatly assist in reduction of the workload in the office.

Once your invoice has been paid, a "virtual gift card" will be set up for the amount of the invoice under your member name and number in the squirrel system. When you come to the club, let your server know you have a gift card and that you would like to use it for your purchase.

### Keep in mind...

It is the responsibility of each member to provide their member number to the server when ordering, and to request a receipt when the bill is paid; this will help to ensure accurate tracking of your spending.

Gift cards must be used by December 31, 2008. If you can not use your gift card, you can request that your amount be transferred to another member by submitting your request in writing to the office.

Catering invoices are treated the same as all other club invoices, interest will be charged on all accounts past due 30 days and failure to pay will result in suspension from the club.

## Storage of Vessels

At the June meeting in 2008, the Committee of Management, passed a motion that vessels that remain in storage after one full year will be charged the regular storage rates, plus an additional 25%. For each additional year in storage, the previous year's rate will be charged plus an additional 25%. Please note: All requests for continued land storage must be approved by the COM as outlined in the yard rules.

The implementation of these fees will begin at the end of June, 2009.

Please refer to the Armdale Yacht Club Rules Respecting Grounds, Moorings, Marinas and other Facilities, under the subtitle General, subsection 16.

To the boaters who prepared, cooked and distributed all the food, thank you.

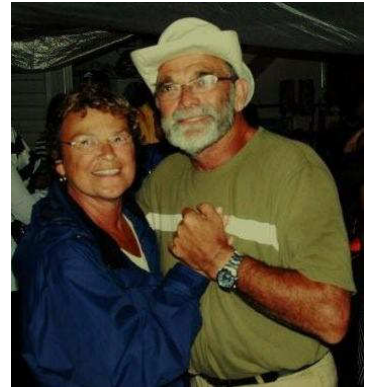
To all the yachters that participated, thank you.

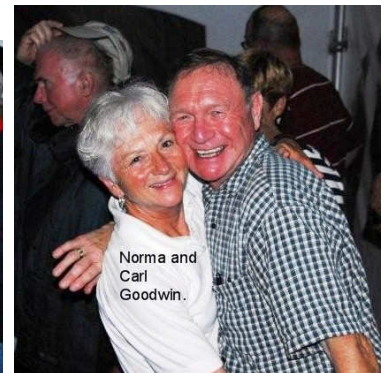
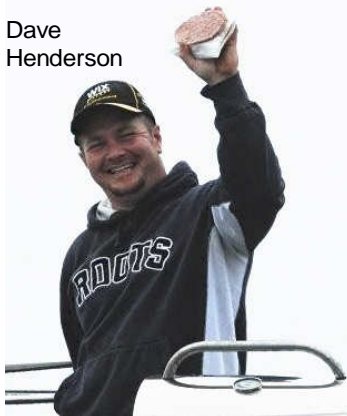

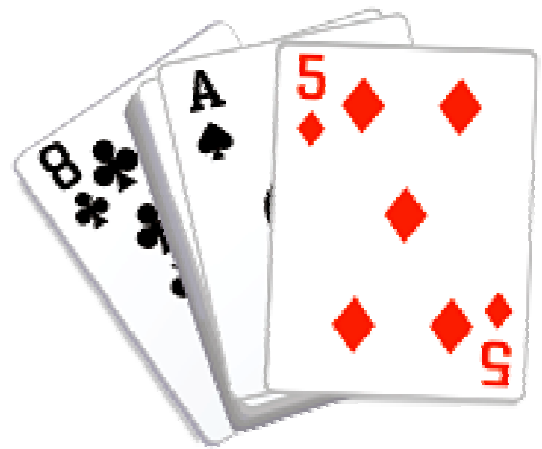

## MESSAGE FROM THE FLEET CAPTAIN SAIL, PAUL BEZANSON

The AYC Club Championship has been completed.

Generally, racers at the club describe races that start and finish at the Club as three races rolled into one. The first race is the race out the Arm. The second race is in the Harbour and the third race (which is generally the decisive one) is back up the Arm.

This year was no different except the first two days, the decisive race was in the Harbour.

The first two days, the wind was south east which allowed the wind to funnel up the Arm. The winds were the same for all the boats in the Arm so large gains were few and far between. In the Harbour on the first day, the winds were light with numerous holes so decisions competitors made regarding where to go made large differences.

On the second day there was a little more wind in the Harbour but there was a significant wind shift to the east which favoured boats that went that way. Additionally, a cruise ship made an appearance on the race course on the second day that caused grief to some of the competitors.

The third and final race was run in brisk westerly winds. The geography of the Harbour makes it difficult to set a good course with this wind direction; however, the best was done with what we were given. In this race, the third part (racing back up the Arm) was the decisive leg as the first boats to enter the Arm reached halfway up it while the boats further behind had to beat the entire way.
